We are delighted to be able to offer clubs as taster sessions for children at Sissinghurst to try new sports or things over the course of the year.


Please remember we offer our wrap around care if you require childcare facilities rather than an activity club.

Kooth is a mental health and wellbeing platform that offers online counselling support. Not only do we offer access to counselling, at Kooth we feature self help tools including online journaling, goal setting and mindfulness techniques. We also have a community space on our Kooth magazine and discussion boards where young people can give and receive advice and support from others their age.

We are commissioned, and therefore free to young people at the point of need, by the local ICB who are keen to make sure every young person aged 10 - 25 in Kent is aware of their access to this platform.

We are a website at <u>www.kooth.com</u> that is accessible on all browsers and through all devices, including mobile, tablet and desktop.

We also have some exciting news to share! Our Qwell adult service was launched on 1st of October and will be rolled out for the whole population of Kent & Medway for those aged 18+. Qwell works the same as Kooth but is aimed at adults. The content and layout are different but the services we offer for adults are the same as for young people. You can access Qwell at <u>www.qwell.io</u>

Kooth and Qwell are somewhat different from traditional support services that may not be available after the end of the working day. We are staffed by fully trained and qualified counsellors who are available until 10pm each night, 365 days per year. We've found that over 70% of contact with the service is made by young people after traditional office hours.

With no long waiting times or referral process, Kooth and Qwell are a fantastic way for young people and adults to get the help and support they need, when they need it, rather than having to wait long periods for an appointment.
