## **Meet your child's new teacher, Parent Evenings and Open Afternoons 2025-26**

**Tuesday 9 September – Meet your child's new teacher** - We are offering the opportunity for parents/carers to come into school early next term so your child can show you their work, classrooms, staff that work with them and so on. It will also be an opportunity for you to ask any questions to staff and see the kind of materials we use to help them learn and look at their learning so far. The session **runs from 3.20pm until 4.00pm** and parents/carers should head to classes via the main reception once you have collected your child at the school gate.

Parent evenings are all held in school with teachers ready to meet parents in the hall and parents free to look around the classrooms and visit your child's room to see their books. You will receive information about booking your appointment time nearer the dates.

We also hold 3 open afternoons on the last day of each long term, so you have a planned opportunity to come into school several times a year to speak with teachers about how your child is getting on, anything you may want to know about helping your child at home and to see your child's work.
