Our Learning Journey:

As part of this topic, the children will contrast characters from stories, develop their own stories, make story maps, explore modern tales and tales from different cultures and many more fun things!

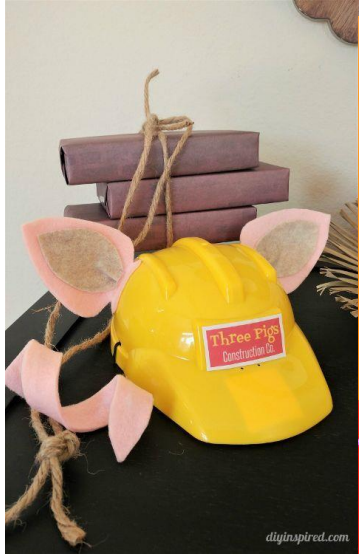

Here is a list of activities that you might like to try at home linked to our learning journey topic:

<p><u>Become a writer</u></p> <p>Can you write your own fairy tale? If you make a book you can bring it in to read to the class.</p>	<p><u>Happily Ever After</u></p> <p>Design your own castle for your happily ever after. You could draw and label your design before making it.</p>	<p><u>Beanstalk to Giant</u></p> <p>Can you get some seeds and try to grow your own plant? Can you measure how big it gets?</p>	<p><u>I want...</u></p> <p>Make a poster persuading someone to do something that you want. E.g. no more tidying my homework because.. No more homework because...</p>	<p><u>Story Teller</u></p> <p>Film yourself acting out a scene from your favourite fairy tale. You could use props and costumes too.</p>
<p><u>Tasty Ever After</u></p> <p>Make a meal or snack inspired by a fairy tale.</p>	<p><u>Character Design</u></p> <p>Make a fairy tale character as a puppet or in any creative way you can think of.</p>	<p><u>Sing Like Rapunzel</u></p> <p>Rapunzel sings about what she does at different times of the day. What is your daily routine? Maybe you could draw it.</p>	<p><u>Emergency!</u></p> <p>The pigs are being chased by the wolf! Come up with a plan for how you will stop him and save them.</p>	<p><u>Magical Door</u></p> <p>Create a miniature magical door for your bedroom at home. What exciting adventures will happen behind the door? Come and tell us at school.</p>
<p><u>Magic Wand</u></p> <p>Make your own wand and write a magic spell.</p>	<p><u>2D/3D Castle</u></p> <p>Make a castle picture or a real castle out of 2D/ 3D shapes.</p>	<p><u>Recycled Home</u></p> <p>Can you use recycled resources to make a home for a fairy tale creature?</p>	<p><u>Finding Facts Online</u></p> <p>Use the internet to find out facts about real bears, wolves and pigs. Draw a picture or write a fact to share with your friends.</p>	<p><u>Map Drawing</u></p> <p>Little Red Riding Hood followed a map to get to Grandmas. Draw a map to show how you get to your family or friend's house.</p>
